#### From the Pastor's Desk

February is the prelude to a very busy season in the Church year. This month, we continue with the revelations of Jesus as the Christ in his early earthly ministry. Coincidentally, our Thursday morning Bible Study is also focusing on Jesus' early ministry. As a reminder, we are viewing episodes of "The Chosen". More importantly, we spend some time afterward discussing what we saw, what it meant to each of us, and how viewing Jesus' (and his followers') ministry in this format helps us to understand more fully what the Scriptures hold for us.

Of course, our Clean Plate ministry/mission is also in full swing. I invite everyone to come out and fellowship with friends and meet new people. This is a time that draws everyone together more fully and helps us do what early Christians did on a much more frequent basis – meet over a meal. Many thanks go out to all the hands that are involved in the cooking, serving, and clean-up of these meals.

February is also the month in which Valentine's Day is celebrated, adding to all the activities of the month. Have you planned anything special for your sweetie this Valentine's Day?

Then, skipping just barely into March, Transfiguration Sunday occurs; which marks a dramatic shift in the focus of Jesus' mission. He turns his mission focus directly toward Jerusalem. The Transfiguration ministry shift brings us into the season of Lent, which we begin with Ash Wednesday.

This year, Ash Wednesday falls on the first Wednesday of March; which presents a rare opportunity for the Slate Ridge Clean Plate ministry. At the January Session meeting, it was decided that we will offer ashes to anyone who desires them at the Ash Wednesday Clean Plate meal. Additionally, we will have a short Communion Service right there in the fellowship hall. Remember, Jesus and the disciples were in engaged in a celebratory meal (think something like Thanksgiving) when Jesus spoke the words we use for communion to this day. Rest assured, it will be a <u>brief</u> time to offer the Lord's Supper to anyone in attendance. Can you think of any better way to kick off the season of Lent? When the suggestion was made at Session to offer Communion on that date, I couldn't have been more pleased, and enthused, with our Session's recognition of our role in Christ's church.

It has already been a long, hard winter. But Ground Hog Day is Sunday, February  $2^{nd}$ . Maybe Punxsutawney Phil will have some good news for us. Regardless, stay safe, stay warm – and please do reach out to the church office if there is anything your church family can help with – not only in these cold weather months, but all year long.

#### Souper Bowl of Caring

In 1990, a simple prayer: "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl

football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat" was delivered to a small youth group at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, SC led by Brad Smith, who was serving as a seminary intern at the time.

This gave birth to an idea. Why not harness the energy and enthusiasm of Super Bowl weekend, a time when people come together for football, food and fun, to unite the nation for a higher good? Individuals and groups could collect dollars in soup pots and canned food for those in need and send every dollar and food

donation DIRECTLY to a local charity of THEIR choice. The first year, they invited 22 area churches to join the team and collected \$5,700 with 100% of donations distributed to local-area charities. That was 1990. Since then, Tackle Hunger, with its signature Souper Bowl of Caring event has become a national, grass-roots, youth-inspired movement where ordinary people are doing extraordinary good. Over \$193 MILLION in dollars and food has been generated while benefiting thousands of soup kitchens, food banks, meal programs and other hunger-relief charities in local communities.

The Slate Ridge Presbyterian Church will be participating, along with churches across the country, on February 9, the date of the 2025 Super Bowl.

#### It's Proud Grandparents Time: Patti and Jim Gibney!



LOCK HAVEN, Pa. – IUP senior cross country runner, Dan Gibney, was named to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Fall Top 10 team, announced by the league Wednesday afternoon (January 22, 2025). Initiated in the 1998-99 academic year, the PSAC Top 10 Awards are designed to recognize student-athletes who excel in both the classroom and in athletic competition. The Top 10 Award is selected by the conference's sports information directors and given to five males and five females in each athletic season: fall, winter and spring. Gibney was honored with the 2024 Men's Cross

**Country Champion Scholar Award for his perfect 4.0 grade point average** through 87 credits in pursuit of a degree in Safety, Health, & Environmental Applied Sciences. He earned All-PSAC First Team in 2024, Second Team honors in both 2022 and 2023, All-Region in 2024, and three academic awards. **This season he marked two personal bests** in the 6k and 8k, which included a first-place finish in the 6k at the WLU Invitational (18:45.2). Gibney finished second at PSAC Championships in the 8k (25:36.5) and at NCAA Atlantic Regional Championships he placed 13th in the 10k (30:43.4). **Gibney becomes the 72nd IUP student-athlete to earn PSAC Top 10 honors**. Gibney is the fifth IUP men's cross country/track and field runner to earn PSAC Top 10 honors. And – Dan is the grandson of Patti and Jim Gibney!
